ANNOUNCEMENTS:

• ODOT is hosting an open house Tuesday, February 13th, at 4:00 pm at the Athens Community Center to discuss the US33 widening. All intersections in Athens County along that project will become interchanges instead of at-grade crossings.

NEW BUSINESS:

CONTINUING DISCUSSIONS

- City/County Sewer Expansion Project- Lenny Eliason
 - O Phases 6&7 are wrapping in May, possibly earlier depending on the weather
 - A public meeting in New Marshfield took place recently regarding sewer and now a decision must be made regarding funding.
 - o There is a potential that Radford Road might need to be closed for a couple of days. Those conversations are happening and a decision will be reached soon.
- Athens County Land Bank-Chris Chmiel
 - The next round of demolition throughout the county will be starting soon

- o There's money available to tear down structures that are not owned by the land bank.
- o The land bank is working with the Health Department to condemn properties

• Broadband Expansion and Access-

o Amesville is still waiting on ARC approval. It has been 18 months.

• Age Friendly Athens County (AFAC)- Amy Lipka

 Healthy Aging Grant guidelines are live on the Health Department and County websites. These are quick action projects. Five grants of \$15,000 will be awarded.

SR 682 Corridor-

- The SR56 roundabout preliminary designs are completed. There is a possibility for a delay but that will be determined later today.
- The City of Athens received Safe Routes for All funding for pedestrian infrastructure all the way to Morrison Gordon school

• Appalachian Community Grants-

o Round 2 of funding is anticipated to start anytime now.

PLANNER'S REPORT: Laura Olbers

- On the advice of ODOT, we will not pursue funding for Hockingport sidewalks this year.
- Athens County Together 2024 funding cycle will start accepting team registrations in March.

CITY, VILLAGE, TOWNSHIP AND ORGANIZATIONAL REPORTS:

- Athens County Auditor's Office
- Village of Amesville-Mayor Goosman
 - A lot of entities are signing up to participate in YODEL, an aggregated calendar that the Athens County Foundation is sponsoring, hoping to pull all community events into one space.

• Ohio University-Jason Pyles

- Ohio University is starting a comprehensive road maintenance project.
- o It is official that three new buildings will be built: A health resource center near Heritage Hall, a College of Fine Arts building, and a dorm on South Green

• Athens City County Health Department

• Active Transportation tabling has been happening around the county this month to get community input on prioritizing road corridors.

• City of Athens-Mayor Patterson, Rob Delach

- Megan Jennings, the newly hired City Planner, starts on Monday the 12th.
- o 28 municipalities are receiving \$12.5 million for EV charging stations from Dayton to Athens, to include more than 200 charging points. East Elementary and Morrison Gordon are getting Level 2&3 charging stations. Ohio University and the City of Athens are also getting several charging stations.
- o Local Infrastructure Hub has opened up round two of their free bootcamp.

o The new sewer expansion to Carpenter Road is completed.

- The Engineer's Office submitted TAP and Systemic Safety grants through ODOT for the Johnson Rd project, which would include buying right of way, dealing with utilities, and storm water. It is anticipated to be a \$1.6 million dollar project.

- The Village of Chauncey applied to the Ohio Rail Commission for a grade separation study for the West Bailey Road area to the park. That study will be conducted this summer
- A home repair fair will take place March 23rd from 12:00pm-3:00 at the Quaker Meeting House

o Continuing work on grants and radio equipment inventory

• HAPCAP-

- Mobility Coordinators are working with a consulting company out of Portland, OR to create a Transit Development Plan.
- Athens Transit will be receiving three buses that were ordered over a year ago over the next couple of months, as wells as three additional buses from Youngstown, OH.

- o Annual tree ordering is wrapping up.
- o ACSWD received a grant to deal with invasive species in the County

• COAD-Megan Riddlebarger

- Solar For All has allocated \$200 million statewide in funding. Many houses in Athens County are eligible by their census tract.
- o Lead Safe Ohio offers up to \$50,000 for homes and \$100,000 for commercial structures for lead abatement.
